SEFI Francesco Maffioli Award of Excellence for Developing Learning and Teaching in Engineering Education

The SEFI Francesco Maffioli Award, launched by SEFI (European Society for Engineering Education), to commemorate its late President Prof. Francesco Maffioli (Politecnico du Milano), is awarded by SEFI, to individual teachers, or a team of teachers, of higher engineering education institutions that are members of SEFI, in recognition of open-minded development of curriculum, learning environments or tools, novel didactics, methods or systems in engineering studies.

The award consists in a presentation at the SEFI Annual Conference and one free registration to attend the conference (*one person*, *if a team*) as well as a cheque of \le 750.

The Chair of the 2019 Francesco Maffioli Award is **Prof. John Mitchell**, Vice-dean for Education at University College London, member of SEFI Board of Directors.

Only Institutional Members of SEFI are eligible to nominate their engineering educators.

Evaluation criteria and nomination template

Evaluation and selection will be based on the extent to which the nominee's description of the development of learning and teaching in engineering education outlines

- Background and underlying ideas (rationale)
- National/regional/local context
- Sources of inspiration e.g. existing knowledge, including references about university teaching/engineering education (Scholarship of Teaching & Learning)
- Applied teaching methods and grounds for choice of methods
- Methods for collection and analysis of evidence
- · Results, including effects on student learning outcome
- Sharing / publication of results (seminars, conferences, journals)
- Significance for Engineering Education elaborating on local/regional/national/international applicability and impact

It is highly recommended to structure nominations along these themes.

The word count of nominations should not exceed 1200 words (including an abstract of max. 200 words). Name and affiliation of the nominator and the nominee is not part of the wordcount.
